1. ANNOUNCEMENT

Williams Event Management Pty Ltd, hereafter called the Promoter will conduct The 2 Stroke Nationals for 2 Stroke bikes in the following classes, 65cc 9 to under 12, 85cc 12 to under 16, 125cc 13 to under 16, Senior All Powers and Retro All Powers plus 20 years.

2. JURISDICTION

2.1 The abovementioned meeting has been authorised by Motorcycling Australia which has issued the Motorcycling Australia Permit Number 2120, 2121 & 2122 and is open to holders of current Motorcycling Australia National competition Licenses. As this is an Amateur Series riders who have finished in the top 10 out right in the Australian Championships MX1 or MX2 classes in the last 2 years are not eligible. (One event licenses can be used for senior riders who have held a Senior national license in the last 5 years)

2.2 The meeting will be held in accordance with the current General Competition Rules (GCRs) contained in the Manual of Motorcycle Sport, these Supplementary Regulations, and any final instructions approved by MA. By entering this meeting all parties agree to comply with these rules, regulations, by-laws and instructions.

3. EVENT OFFICIALS

The following officials will be overseeing the meeting:

4. ENTRIES

4.1 Entries will open on January 10th, a maximum of 40 entries will be accepted per class, preference will be given to riders who place a series entry, a lodgment of entry isn't a guarantee of acceptance.

4.2 In the case of postponement or abandonment of the meeting, all or any part of the entry fee may be retained by Williams Event Management, if such retention is approved by MA.

4.3 Entry fees will be charged on the Monday prior to the round, if a rider is unable to attend they must cancel their entry prior to processing 5 pm Monday before the event.

5. ENTRY FEE

5.1 Entry fee for each class is \$99.00 plus Rider levy \$27.50

5.2 Payment by credit card only. Via online entry system.

5.3 Mylaps transponder will be used, if you don't have one, Hire transponders will be available at a fee of \$20.00, a cash deposit of \$50.00 will be held and returned when you return the Transponder back to sign-on. Any transponders not returned will forfeit the deposit and the transponder must be sent back to WEM by Express post, any lost transponders will be invoiced to the rider at \$400.00
You must have your own bracket, these will be available to purchase at sign-on for \$10.00

6. ENTRY PASSES

As the entry fee has been set low, there will be no passes issued, admission will be \$10 per person. Round 2 and 3 will have camping available for competitor families, a fee of \$20 per site will be charge by the Host Club.

7. INSURANCE

7.1 National Personal Accident Scheme provides basic cover for death and permanent disability.

7.2 Ambulance Insurance is compulsory for licensees.

It is strongly recommended that competitors give consideration to taking out weekly benefits insurance.

8. MEDICAL SERVICES

Medical service will be provided at each round in accordance the manual of Motorcycle Sport 2019

8.1 Helmet Eject Systems

All riders must have a helmet eject system in the helmet, these will be available at the sign-on they are \$90.00.

9. SCRUTINEERING

9.1 Scrutineering will use the self-scrutineering system with on the spot checks conducted throughout the event.

9.2 In addition to supervising the pulling down and checking of machines after official protests have been received by the Clerk of Course in accordance with the GCRs, the Steward can order that any machine be measured and if this occurs the Scrutineer will supervise a team member to pull down any machine that has taken part in the event. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

9.3 Machines will not be sealed for later checking after the event. All machines that are to be pulled down and scrutineered will take place at the circuit before the machine is released by the Scrutineer. A member of the rider's team must be available at all times to carry out the strip down under the control of the Scrutineer. Failure to comply with this regulation will result in this matter being referred to the Clerk of Course for further action.

10. CLASSES OF COMPETITION

Junior classes

65cc cup 9 to under 12

85cc cup 12 to under 16 (small & Big wheel)

125cc cup 13 to under 16

Senior classes

All Powers 2 stroke

All Powers retro, frame and engine plus 20 years (CR500 and KX500 all models standard frame and engine)

11. ENTRIES TO CONSTITUTE A CLASS

11.1 A minimum of 15 entries is required to constitute a class

12. STARTS AND FINISHES

A 15 second board will be used at the start and Checkered flag at the end of the race, riders must cross the timing loop too be deemed a finisher.

13. FLAGS AND SIGNALS

Yellow flag held stationary caution required, continue racing passing allowed.

Yellow flag waved, a considerable reduction in speed no overtaking, no Jumping and no passing or gaining advantage.

Medical Flag, standing on pegs walking pace follow direction of officials

Red Flag race stopped slow down and return to start gate and await direction

14. RACE FORMAT

All classes will receive 18 minutes practice Qualifying / green flag will come out at 9 minutes

All races will run to 15 minutes, following qualifying the number of laps will be determined.

15. EVENT SCHEDULE

Gates Open to competitors at 1pm Saturday, please don't arrive before as there will be no access

Sign-on all rounds will be Saturday 1:30pm to 4 pm

Track walk will be open 2pm to 3.45pm Saturday

Practice will commence at 8am Sunday.

For the purposes of drug and alcohol testing, the commencement of the meeting will be deemed to be 8am Sunday with the completion of the meeting for the participant being when the participant has vacated the venue.

16. AWARDS

Round and championship trophies will be awarded for all classes.

17. PRESENTATIONS

Presentation will take place 10 minutes after the final race, top 3 from each class must attend.

18. MACHINES AND RIDERS

18.1 All machines entered must comply with the current GCRs for Motocross competition.

18.2 Multiple entry of the one machine in the same class of competition is not permitted.

18.3 Change of machine is allowed but you must notify the CoC or Race Secretary and have the correct transponder fitted.

19. RIDING NUMBERS

When entering on the online entry system you will be required to pick a number, this number will become your registered number for the 2 stroke nationals. All bikes must run the 2 stroke header on the front plate, available for download under the competitors section of the 2 stroke website.

20. GRID POSITIONS

Grid positions for all 3 races will come from Qualifying, a waiting zone will be used and all bikes must be in the waiting zone 10 minutes prior to the start, late comers will receive last pick.

21. RIDERS' BRIEFING

Riders briefing will be electronic, a venue briefing will take place on the start line at 4pm on Saturday at each round and all riders, Parents or guardians must attend.

22. CIRCUIT DESCRIPTION

Licensed motocross tracks will be used.

23. TRACK INSPECTION

All competitors will be given the opportunity to walk and inspect the track prior to any on track participation. This inspection must be done on foot and competitors are reminded that service vehicles may be in operation on the circuit at this time.

Track walk will be between 2pm and 3:45pm Saturday Only.

23.1 Track Dissatisfaction

Competitors who are not satisfied with any aspects of the track can present these concerns to the Clerk of Course if those concerns cannot be resolved, the competitor will be invited to withdraw from the meeting.

24. FACILITIES

Catering will be available at all events.

Camping will not be available at round 1

Camping will be available at rounds 2 and 3 a fee of \$20 per family will apply for camping, you must have a camping pass in your car, these will be available at Sign-on.

25. NOISE

A noise curfew will apply, all generators and noise must stop at 9:30pm on Saturday night
No starting of bikes until 7:50am Sunday.

Noise testing may take place at any time at the discretion of the Chief Scrutineer or the Clerk of Course.

26. ANTI-DOPING POLICY

26.1 All competitors and officials are advised that drug testing may take place in accordance with MA's Anti-Doping Policy, as carried out by the Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority. Refer to MA website for details.

28.2 If any doubts exist over banned substances it is recommended competitors contact the Drugs in Sport Hotline, ph: 1800 020 506. When drug testing takes place, the payment of prizemoney may be delayed at MA's discretion or until the results of the tests are known.

29. DRUG AND ALCOHOL TESTING

All competitors and officials are advised that random drug and alcohol testing may take place during the competition. Refer to MA website for details on the Safety Policy – Drug and Alcohol testing.

30. CODES OF BEHAVIOUR

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Codes of Behaviour contained within MA's Member Protection Regulations, found at www.ma.org.au which is a guide to appropriate behaviour at all motorcycle race meetings. These Codes of Behaviour apply to this meeting and will be enforced.

31. FIRE EXTINGUISHERS

All riders must have a minimum 2kg, dry powder A:B (E) class, working fire extinguisher in their pit area

32. ELECTRONIC COMMUNICATIONS AND SOCIAL MEDIA

All competitors, officials and parents are reminded of MA's Electronic Communications and Social Media Policy, found at www.ma.org.au, which sets out a framework for acceptable online behavior where communications involve fellow MA members, volunteers, officials, coaches, sponsors, partners, staff and any other connected persons.
